

LET'S TALK COMMUNITY CHATS

Our community-led program Let's Talk Community Chats has been expanding into more locations including Philadelphia, Atlanta and Ithaca and other communities requesting to partner with us.

Let's Talk Community Chats is a community-based program that ensures families' lived experiences regarding safe sleep practices are heard and respected.

This program addresses sleep-related infant death through a maternal health equity lens and takes into account the lack of access to accurate, non-biased information. It offers up solutions for socio-economic and cultural challenges to adopting safe sleep practices and breastfeeding.

Let's Talk Community Chats are led by trusted community care providers with training from First Candle on AAP safe sleep guidelines, breast/chest feeding support and education on the proper and safe use of infant products.

Trained community facilitators including doulas, lactation consultants, dads and grandparents engage with families in the community on a monthly basis at places families frequently visit. The facilitators are paid a stipend as is the host organization to coordinate and facilitate.

Let's Talk gives every member of the family time for in-depth one-on-one conversations about their unique situations. Most importantly, the information families receive is not only accurate but relevant to them. free of bias and judgment. The support for families includes information on local social service resources and distribution of infant products.

INFANT LOSS AND STILLBIRTH BEREAVEMENT CONFERENCE

In October we hosted our Infant Loss and Stillbirth Bereavement Conference. This was a hybrid event held in Norwalk, CT and brought parents together both in-person and online to learn from grief experts, share their stories and come together to support one another. Sessions included a dad's workshop, how to manage grief as a couple, the stress of having a Rainbow baby as well as healing through art and breathwork. We ended with a very special remembrance ceremony for our little angels.







MEMORIAL TREES

24/7 GRIEF LINE

We know that having someone to speak with and offer support immediately upon the death of a baby is critical. This coming year we are working to



In partnership with Mary Kay and the Arbor Day Foundation First Candle plants a tree in memory of a baby who has died from Sudden Unexpected Infant Death or Stillbirth. Anyone can request a tree be planted in honor of a baby in one of the locations selected by Arbor Day Foundation. This is an incredibly special way to honor our little angels and we're grateful to Mary Kay for facilitating this program. To date, 256 trees have been planted.

A cornerstone of our work is supporting families in their grief. To that end, we provide a grief line for families to receive 1:1 support and online support groups. We also have peer support volunteers who are available for ongoing connections with families.

PARTNERSHIP AND **ADVOCACY**

Sadly, this year for the first time in decades, we saw the rates of infant deaths increase. What's more, the disparity between Black infant deaths and non-Black has widened. We have redoubled our efforts to elevate the issue of birth equity and align ourselves with maternal justice advocates who are advancing policies to end racial disparities.

To this end, we are working with Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies Coalition of Georgia on a three-million-dollar, multi-year grant through the Health and Human Services Office of Minority Health to support development and implementation of new policies and innovative practices to address policies that may create or perpetuate health disparities in regard to infant mortality.

We are in the second year of the program and have convened a community multi-sector task group and conducted focus groups and environmental scans to better understand the specific issues impacting families as it relates

This year the bi-annual International Society for the Study and Prevention of Perinatal and Infant Death (ISPID) Conference was held in Florence, Italy.

The conference brings together researchers, scientists, healthcare professionals and parents from around the world. Our Board member Brian Scruton and his wife Lindsie attended and Brian spoke on a panel about his podcast Guys and Grief and how to reach grieving parents in unique ways.

Our own Barb Himes was honored as Distinguished Educator, a well-deserved honor. The event culminated with a beautiful memorial service for all of the babies gone too soon.

We're excited and honored to announce that First Candle has been selected to be the host of the 2025 ISPID Conference which will be held in Boston. More information and details will be coming in the next year.

NEW YORK CITY MARATHON

This year we had 22 runners as part of our team for the TCS New York City Marathon who collectively raised over \$90,000. FAMILY EVENTS

In addition to the Marathon, families once again hosted in person events to support First Candle. Families raised over \$50,000 to support bereavement initiatives and our Let's Talk Community Chat events. Ellie and Dan Crowley have raised over \$10,000 for the Griffin's Gift Fund. Jason and Lynsie Murphy held their 15th annual Taylor Cain Golf Classic in August in memory of their son Taylor Cain Murphy. Jason and Lynsie raised \$37,000 in 2023 for First Candle. Jonah Blank, a 13 year old SIDS sibling has chosen to support First Candle with his Bar Mitzvah project, raising money and collecting diapers in memory of his brother Gavin.





